Words of Confession

The Word of God

Psalm 138

I offer you thanks, O God, with all my heart; before the "gods" I sing your praise. I bow down toward your holy temple and I praise your name for your kindness and your faithfulness, for you have exalted above all things your name and your word. On the day I cried out, you answered me and granted strength to my spirit.

All the rulers of the earth will praise you, O God, when they hear the words of your mouth. They will sing of your ways: "How great is the God's glory!" For though God is exalted, you cares for the lowly, but you remain far distant from the proud. Although I walk in the midst of hostility, you preserve my life. You stretch out your hand against the wrath of my enemies, and with your right hand you deliver me.

Acts 16:22-34

The crowd in Philippi joined in the attack on Paul and Silas, and the magistrates had them stripped and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After inflicting many blows on them, they threw them into prison and instructed the jailer to guard them securely. When he received these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and secured their feet to a stake.

About midnight, while Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God as the prisoners listened, there was suddenly such a severe earthquake that the foundations of the jail shook; all the doors flew open, and the chains of all were pulled loose. When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, thinking that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted out in a loud voice, "Do no harm to yourself; we are all here." He asked for a light and rushed in and, trembling with fear, he fell down before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you and your household will be saved."

So they spoke the word of God to him and to everyone in his house. He took them in at that hour of the night and bathed their wounds; then he and all his family were baptized at once. He brought them up into his house and provided a meal and with his household rejoiced at having come to faith in God.

John 16:5-11

Jesus said to his disciples: "Now I am going to the one who sent me, and not one of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I told you this, grief has filled your hearts. But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you.

But if I go, I will send her to you. And when she comes he will convict the world in regard to sin and righteousness and condemnation: sin, because they do not believe in me; righteousness, because I am going to God and you will no longer see me; condemnation, because the ruler of this world has been condemned."
